For many migrants, who have just arrived in France, finding work is the priority. In the absence of proper papers, they obtain false documents or take the identity of a loved one in a valid situation. A short-term solution that prejudices them: under these conditions, it is difficult to obtain a residence permit.

Those who hire them can, however, complete a "request for a work permit to conclude an employment contract with a foreign employee residing in France", nicknamed "Cerfa" by the strikers. This form, which depends on the goodwill of employers, facilitates the procedures at the prefecture for undocumented workers. It is this document that the 150 strikers who have been mobilised for a week are demanding.
